“My wife and I have fond memories of Ernie and Evelyn. One of our fondest memories is when Evelyn was over at LaCrosse not expected to last through the night. Family was called in, and I, as their pastor was called as well. When we arrived, it certainly looked like Evelyn’s prognosis was accurate. Ernie and I went down the hall to a waiting room to discuss her situation. When we got there I asked, “Bro Ernie, what do you want to do?” He said, “can we pray?” Exactly what I wanted to hear. Ernie and I got down on our knees there in that waiting room and went to prayer just like we were in church. In a sense it was kind of humerus.... The waiting room emptied out, and quickly it was just Ernie, myself, and the Lord!
