Joachim "Jim" R. Gocht, age 74, died Saturday, August 10, 2013 at his home in rural Ithaca. He was born January 21, 1939 in Crivitz, WI the son of Albert and Anna (Carstens) Gocht. On June 16, 1973 Jim married Janet Humke in Beloit, Wisconsin. Jim enlisted in the United States Army and joined Special Forces and served in the Vietnam War.

Jim was a Service Manager at Evans Industrial Communications for several years and then moved to Richland Center and worked as a Systems Engineer at General Communications in Richland and the surrounding counties. Jim was very meticulous and passionate about his work. He enjoyed camping, bird watching, photography, and especially enjoyed the surroundings of the earth sheltered home he designed and helped construct. Jim had a special place in his heart for his three brilliant grandchildren.
