Joseph "Joe" N. Rucinski Jr., age 66, died Monday, July 18, 2011 at his home in rural Yuba. He was born February 7, 1945 the son of Joseph N. & Lois (Groves) Rucinski Sr. in Richland Center, Wisconsin. Joe graduated in 1963 from Richland Center High School. Joe served in the U.S. Navy during the Vietnam War on the U.S.S. Randolph from 1964-1966. On August 26, 1967 he married Sharrel Ann Judson at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Richland Center. Joe was a member of the Carpenters Union. He was an avid hunter, fisherman, a prankster and also played a lot of slow pitch softball. Joe was inducted into the Richland Center Wrestling Hall of Fame.
