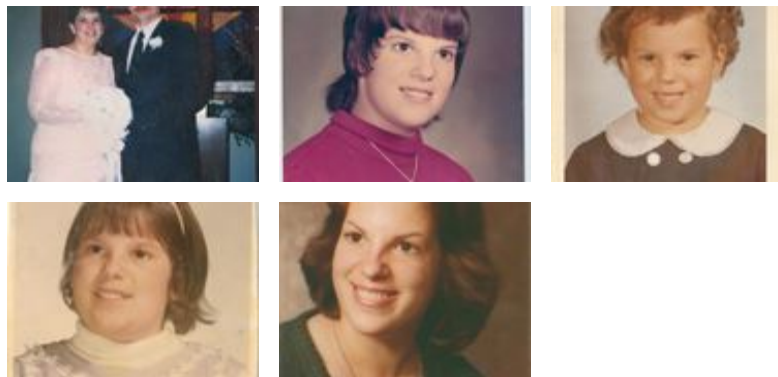

As you could tell from the slideshow mom loved to camp and fish and due to the size of our family it was always hard to get everyone together. However, once a year or every other year we would all get together at Blackhawk Lake. This is probably our favorite memory because all the kids, grandkids, and great-grandkids would be together. She taught many of us and the grandkids how to fish. She would always do a big fish fry with all the fish we would all catch.*
