After separating from the military in 2000 as a Major, he settled back in his hometown, flew for United Airlines (First Officer -737) and owned and operated Nigl's Fine Furniture and Millwork. He was active in the community serving on the Richland District School Board, and Chairman of Richland County Republican Party. Because of his love of trees and wood, he became a board member of Bad Axe Woodland Owners Association, a member of the National Walnut Council, American Legion and Knights of Columbus.
