Richard "Dick" A. Young, age 71, of Hillpoint passed away un-expectantly on Monday, June 16, 2014 at the Richland Center Hospital. Dick was born on January 6, 1943 in Richland Center to Gerald and Lorena (Jackson) Young. He graduated from Lone Rock High School in 1960. He worked for a short time in Madison at the State Office Building. In 1964 he enlisted in the Air Force and served our country in Germany and other areas until 1968. Upon his return to the states he lived with his Aunt Doris and Uncle Walt and their family.

In September of 1968 he started working for the Richland County Sheriff's Department. He was very proud of serving the county for over 42 years.
