Wayne G. Anderson, age 87, of rural Richland Center died Friday, September 16, 2011 at his home in Ithaca Township. Per Wayne's request his body was donated to the School of Medicine & Public Health at the University of Wisconsin. Wayne was born June 5, 1924 at home in Little Willow, the son of Fredrick Charles & Hazel (Janney) Anderson. On April 25, 1950 he married Adelaide Rose Poole at St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church in Richland Center. In 1950 Wayne & Adelaide purchased the farm in Ithaca Township where they raised dairy cows, beef, crops, and registered quarter horses.
